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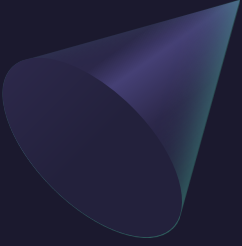
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Who is OIRP?

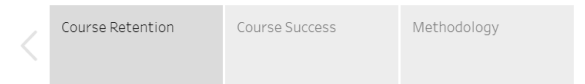

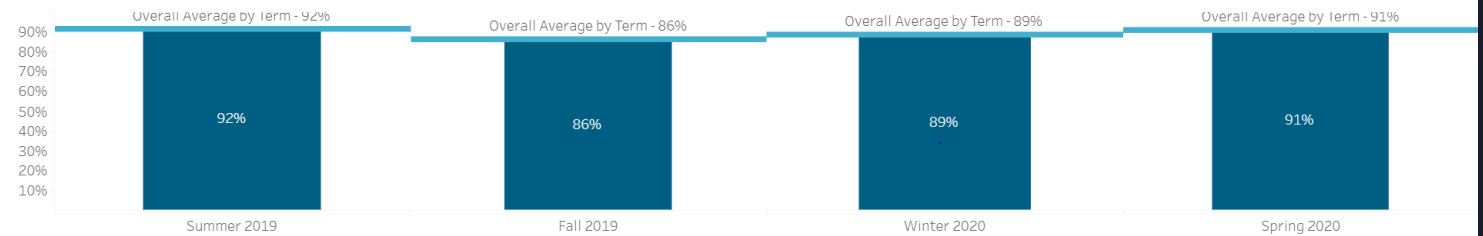

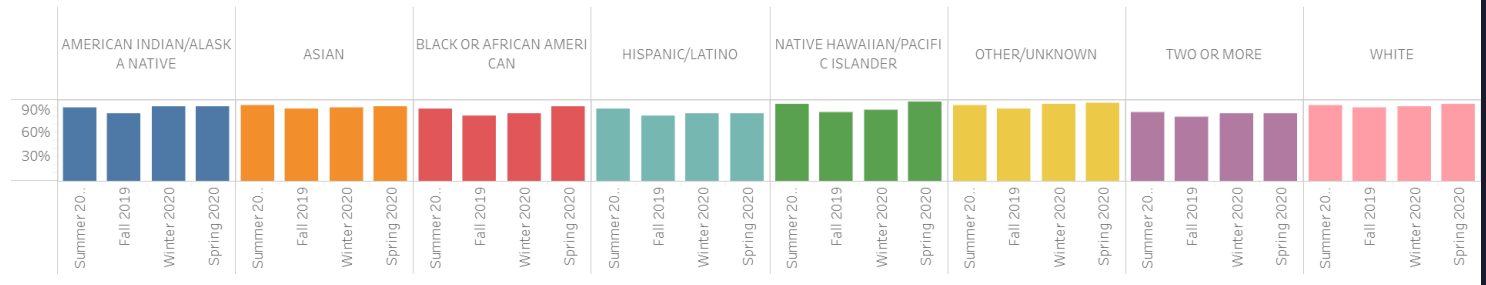
NOCE IER 2019-2020 Learning Progress

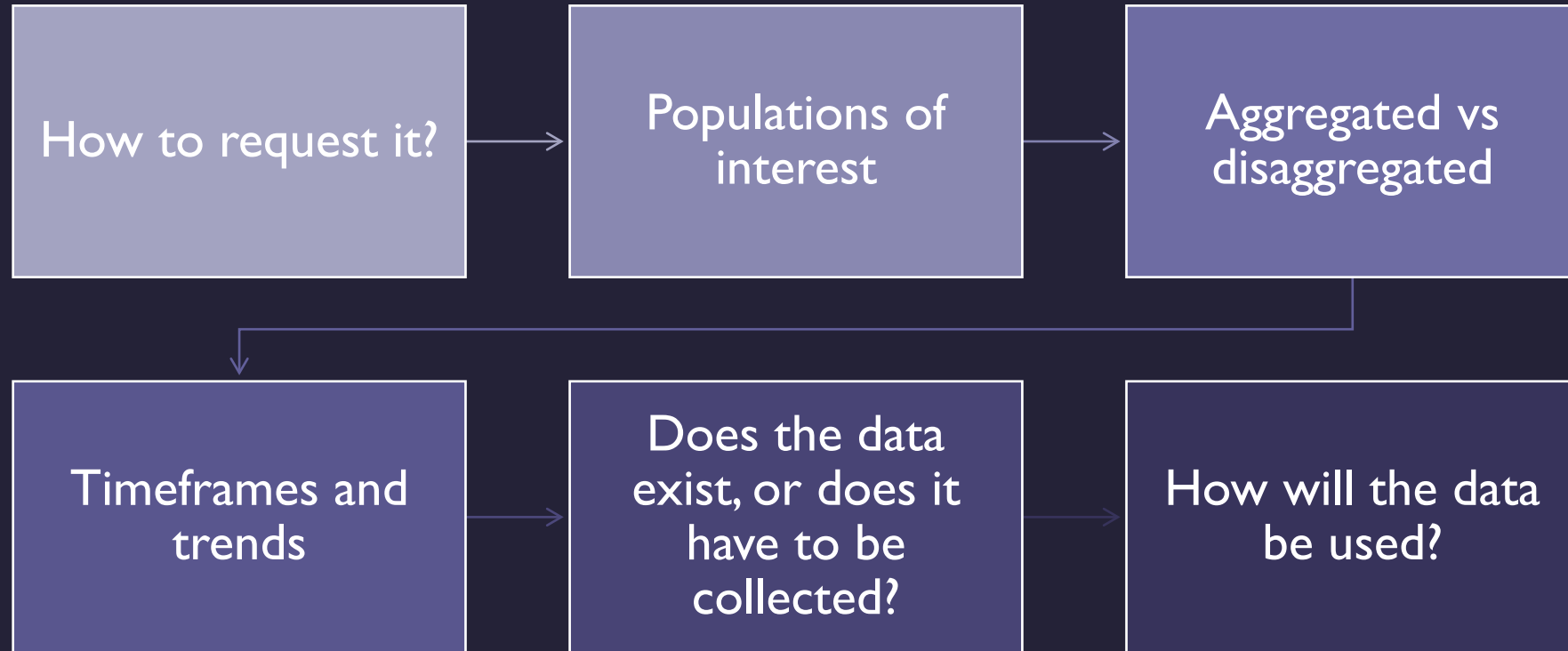


Adult Education Pipeline

PROGRAM REVIEW & PROGRAM PLANNING

- What are the enrollments trends in your program?
 - What students are more likely to be retained or be successful in classes?
 - What external and internal factors impact your program?
 - What additional resources will help serve departmental or student needs?
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EVALUATION

- What services were delivered?
- Who and how many were served?
- Are we reaching our objectives?
- Are the services well implemented?
- Were we able to create the desired changes?
- How can we improve services?

STUDENT FEEDBACK

- What are student's experiences?
- Are there specific needs that are particular to a set of students?
- What are student concerns?
- Are students experiencing barriers? If so, what are those barriers?
- What do students like best?
