### *Institution: North Orange Continuing Education (NOCE)*

**Purpose:** The brief highlights the outcomes achieved by students served at NOCE in the 2021-22 academic year who were enrolled in one or more of the CAEP program areas.

**Dataset:** Data for examining outcomes was primarily obtained from NOCE’s student information system, Banner. Data definitions are adapted from the [2020-21 NOCRC Evaluation Report](#).

## *Institution: Garden Grove Adult Education (GGAE)*

*Dataset:* Data for examining outcomes was provided to NOCE OIRP by the GGAE staff. Data was retrieved from the CAEP Student Gains Report within CASAS TOPSpro Enterprise and from the Burlington English Software Usage Report.

*Outcomes:*

### *Outcomes Achieved by GGAE Students*

- Number of Burlington English licenses purchased: 276
- Number of students who utilized Burlington English software: 495
  - Due to open enrollment, GGAE removes inactive students and add active students utilizing the same BE licenses purchased.
- Number of hours of engagement using the BE curriculum: 3776.42
- Number of students with 12 or more hours of instruction: 298
- Number of students who attained literacy gains: 181 out of 298 (61%)
