PURCHASE A PARKING PERMIT AND BOOK(S)

After confirming your choices, the <u>STATUS</u> column will tell you if you are registered, if the class is closed, or if the class has been cancelled.

Wait List: If the class is closed, some classes have the option of putting yourself on the WAIT LIST which would appear in the drop-down menu under the ACTION column. You may add yourself to the Wait List by choosing the Wait List option in the drop-down menu or you may drop yourself from the class by choosing Drop On-Line. Click on Confirm Your Choices again and your STATUS for that class will show whether you are Wait Listed or Dropped.

STEP 5 – Complete Registration

After you have added all of your classes and are satisfied with your class schedule shown on the registration page, click Complete Registration at the bottom of the registration page. If you fail to complete your registration, you may be dropped from your classes.

STEP 6 – Pay Fees (if any) and Print Out a Receipt

- o Following the registration is the Account Summary by Term. The amount shown next to your Account Balance is due and payable within 72 hours of registering. If payment is not submitted within 72 hours, you may be dropped from your classes.
- o Full payment is required. You may use a Visa or MasterCard to pay online or pay in person with cash or check. To pay by credit card, select Credit Card Payment, select the term, and follow the prompts. \$25 is charged to any students' account for returned check or non-sufficient funds.
- o If the account balance reflected is ZERO, you may return to the Student Tab of myGateway (click on the link located on the top left hand corner of the screen) and click on PRINT SCHEDULE/BILL to print out your registration receipt or log out if do not want to print out a receipt.

- The School of Continuing Education (SCE) offers noncredit classes that are tuition-free and "not for college credit." These classes are state-supported and based on student attendance.
- ⇒ The magic number at SCE is the minimum number of students needed in each class in order for the state to cover the costs of the class including instruction, supplies and administrative costs. If attendance drops below this number, the class may be cancelled.
- ⇒ Noncredit classes include morning, afternoon, and evening offerings to support working

COMPLETE ONLINE ORIENTATION

FOUR EASY STEPS TO ENROLL



OBTAIN OFFICIALLY-SEALED TRANSCRIPTS

Obtain officially-sealed transcripts from all previously attended high schools and bring them to the assessment session (step 4) that you will be attending. Officiallysealed means that the envelope from the institution CANNOT be opened. Opened transcripts WILL NOT be accepted.



APPLY FOR AN SCE BANNER ID

Apply online at www.sce.edu or visit any SCE Admissions and Registration Office. You will need a BANNER ID number before you can complete steps 3 and 4.

Do not wait until registration opens to apply for a BANNER ID as the process may take up to 48 hours before you receive your ID number. If you apply in person, you will receive your BANNER ID immediately.



COMPLETE THE HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA PROGRAM ONLINE ORIENTATION

Once you have a BANNER ID number, students must complete the required High School Diploma Program online orientation.

- Visit myGateway at mg.nocccd.edu. Use your BANNER ID and PIN to log in.
- In the top left corner of the screen, click on the SCE
- In the SCE Orientations box, scroll down and select High School Diploma Program.
- Follow the directions and complete all sections of the SCE High School Online Orientation and pass a series of short quizzes.
- NOTE: If you do not pass the High School Online Orientation and try to register, you will receive an error message, "cohort restriction," and you will not be able to register for an assessment session. You can take the online orientation several times to successfully complete and pass.

REGISTER FOR A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA PROGRAM ASSESSMENT SESSION

24 hours after you successfully pass the online orientation, you will be eligible to register for a scheduled assessment session.

Students are assessed in English comprehension. Students must register for and complete the required two-hour assessment to enroll in the High School Diploma Program. The Center at which you take your assessment is the Center you must attend to complete your high school diploma.

Refer to the chart on page 13 for assessment session course reference numbers (CRNs) and note the registration period dates and times. The registration period will close early if the session fills before the close date and time.

- Go to myGateway at mg.nocccd.edu and log in by entering your BANNER ID and PIN.
- B. Next, go to the Registration Tools box and select Add or Drop Classes.
- C. Select the term: School of Continuing Ed and then click Submit.
- D. Complete the short survey and click Submit.
 - On the Registration page, scroll down to the Add Classes Worksheet section and, in the first box under the CRNs section, enter the 5-digit CRN for the assessment session you wish to attend (listed in the chart on the page 13).
- Next, click Confirm Your Choices. F.
- Now, click Complete Registration.
- Go to the upper left corner of the screen and click Back to Student Tab to return to the main menu.
- Under the Registration Tools box, select Print Schedule/Bill. Under Print Schedule/Bill select the term you want to view and then click Submit. Click View Schedule/Bill, then right click your mouse anywhere on the page and select Print.
- Bring this printed copy of the Schedule/Bill to the assessment session as proof of your registration. Also bring your officially-sealed transcripts and BANNER ID number.

By District policy, "every course, course section or class shall be open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the School of Continuing Education (SCE)."

CLASS SCHEDULE SUBJECT TO CHANGE: SCE has made every reasonable effort to determine that this class schedule is accurate; however, changes may occur after press time.

CLASSES

ADMISSION TO CLASSES: Students are admitted on a first come. first served basis. Students are not permitted to attend classes in which they are not officially enrolled. Classes 'filled' may have a 'waitlist' already established for students wanting to attend. Nontuition classes: Students must attend the first day of class or lose their spot to a petitioning student.

AUDITING CLASSES: If a student has received a passing grade in a Pharmacy Technician Certificate Program or Medical Assistant Certificate Program course and wishes to repeat the course, the student should submit an Audit Request Form to the CTE Director. For more information about auditing a Pharmacy Technician or Medical Assistant course, please contact 714.808.4673. There is a \$15 fee charged for auditing a couse. Fees charged for auditing a course are subject to change. Auditing other SCE courses is not permitted.

CLASS ATTENDANCE/CANCELLATIONS: Students are expected to attend all classes. If attendance drops, classes may be cancelled. Non-tuition classes may be discontinued during the term if attendance drops. Tuition classes will continue according to schedule once they have started.

WEEKEND POLICY: It is SCE's practice that classes do not normally meet on a weekend following a Friday District holiday or preceding a Monday District holiday. If it is necessary for a class to be held on a holiday weekend, this would be an exception to the

IN-CLASS REGISTRATION: Students must attend the first meeting where in-class registration takes place or they may lose their seat to someone else. A minimum number of students must attend the first class meeting. In-class registration is on a first come, first served hasis

CHILDREN IN CLASS: No children are to attend adult classes.

REGISTRATION LOCATIONS: No matter where the class is held, students can register at any SCE Center: Anaheim (Second Floor), Cypress-Pkg Lot 4: SCE Cypress (Bldg 100), Wilshire (Bldg 300). Registration also available at www.sce.edu.

MINOR STUDENTS: SCE classes are open to those 18 years or older who have been admitted to SCE and are not attending school. Students under 18 who have not graduated from high school may be permitted to attend under special circumstances. It is advisable to contact the campus Dean at the site where the class is offered prior to obtaining the required permission letter from the school that the minor student is attending. If permission to enroll is granted, the minor student may enroll only after the regular registration period so that priority is given to adult students. Children of any age may take Kids' College and Teen Program classes as indicated in the course schedule

NAME CHANGE: Students are encouraged to visit one of the SCE Centers to change their name in the student database. Students must provide a picture ID when requesting a name change.

PARKING

A parking permit is required to park in marked spaces at all three SCE Centers; however, a purchased parking permit does not guarantee a parking space. If you do not have a permit, you will be ticketed. An SCE parking permit applies to any space that is marked for students or any unmarked space. Parking permits are refundable prior to the first class meeting only and must be returned to receive a refund. Please do not back into the parking space or you will be ticketed.

Parking at the SCE Cypress Center requires a virtual parking permit enforced by license plate recognition. You may register your vehicle

To purchase a permit online with a debit or credit card ONLY you will need your vehicle license plate number or the last eight digits of your VIN number. Day permits are also available for purchase by debit or credit card ONLY at any Cypress College parking kiosk. Permits are also valid at the Anaheim Campus and Wilshire Center.

PARKING FEES: Parking is by permit only. Vehicle permits: \$35; motorcycle permits: \$20; both available at each SCE Center's Admission and Registration Office. Daily permits available for \$2 in parking areas. Parking permits are half-year permits that are available from Jan 1-Jun 30 OR Jul 1-Dec 31 (not six months from purchase date).

BUS PASSES: Student bus passes are available at any SCE Center's Admission and Registration Office for students who are enrolled in a minimum of nine hours per week; 30-day passes are available for disabled and senior students; 75-day and 120-day passes are available for all students. Passes are sold year round. The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) provides bus service to each of our three SCE Centers. For more information, call 714.636.7433.

APPORTIONMENT CLASSES: These classes appear as free but are actually funded by the state. Funding is received for each hour of student attendance. The cost of offering the class is covered by these funds. The class may be cancelled if the attendance falls below the level needed to cover the costs of the class. There are 10 recognized areas in Title 5 that are eligible for noncredit education apportionment. SCE offers noncredit classes in the following areas:

- 1. English as a Second Language
- Citizenship for Immigrants
- 3. Elementary and Secondary Basic Skills
- 4. Health and Safety
- 5. DSPS (Substantial Disabilities)
- 6. Parenting
- 7. Older Adults
- 8. Short-Term Vocational

COMMUNITY SERVICES CLASS FEES: Classes NOT funded by the state are supported by student tuition. Students must cover the cost of the class through fees. Additional instructional material or supply fees may be required. These classes will not be cancelled if attendance drops during the term. While late registration is permissible in most classes, full payment of tuition fees is always required.

PAYING FOR CLASSES: Full payment is required at the time of registration. Cash, checks, money orders, and credit cards (MasterCard and VISA) are accepted. \$25 will be charged to any students' account where a check is returned for non-sufficient funds. **HOLDS:** SCE will withhold transcripts, registration privileges, or any combination hereof from any student or former student who has failed to pay all outstanding fees (from current or previous terms) or for other administrative reasons.

REFUNDS: To receive a refund, a Refund Petition Form must be submitted at least two (2) full business days before the first class meeting. A \$10 processing fee will be deducted from all refunds one time, per term, per student except for classes cancelled by SCE. Refunds will be processed two weeks after the term begins. No refunds on books. Refund checks to students enrolled in the Kids' College & Teen Program will be made to the name of the student of record as required by State Education Code regulations. The only other criteria considered for refunds are circumstances in which the course differs from the way it was described in the class schedule, such as incorrect start date, time, or wrong location. You may request a credit valid for six months toward any fee-based course. Requests for credits must be submitted prior to the second class meeting of the course being dropped.

RECORDS & IDENTIFICATION CARDS

STUDENT RECORDS: California Administrative Code, Title V, and District policy states that students can review their student records any time. All student records are located at the SCE Wilshire Center. Transcript requests are accepted in person or by mail (the Transcript Request Form may be printed through the SCE website at www.sce.edu). Allow 10 business days for processing.

RECORDS & RELEASE OF RECORDS: The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords students certain rights with respect to their education records. They have the right to:

*inspect and review their education records

*have some control over the disclosure of information from their education record

*seek to amend incorrect education records

In accordance with FERPA, SCE may release or publish, without the student's prior consent, items in the category of public (directory) information. The NOCCCD Board of Trustees has identified the following as public (directory) information:

*Degrees and awards received by students, including honors, scholarships, athletic awards, and Dean's List recognition;

*Student participation in officially recognized activities and sports including weight, height, and high school of graduation for athletic team members:

*Dates of attendance.

Students who wish to restrict this information must submit a written request to the Registrar's Office at the SCE Wilshire Center. Requests must be filed within 15 calendar days from the beginning of each trimester a student is in attendance. For more information, call 714. 992.9502.


CLASSIFICATION OF STUDENTS: Students are classified as fulltime when enrolled and attending 12 hours or more of instruction per week. Students enrolled in fewer than 12 hours per week of instruction are considered part-time students. Enrollment and attendance can be confirmed after the student has attended two consecutive weeks of instruction.

CATALOG RIGHTS POLICY: SCE issues a new catalog each academic year beginning in the fall term and, if needed, subsequent addendums for the winter, spring, and summer terms. information published in the catalog or catalog addendum is in effect for the academic year beginning with the fall term and concluding with the summer term.

The course requirements for a specific certificate program may change from one catalog to the next and, therefore, may change during the period of time that a student attends SCE. Catalog rights, established when a student first takes classes at SCE, protect the student from being held responsible for additional program requirements that may be added to a later catalog.

Students maintain catalog rights by maintaining continuous enrollment in one of the following courses at SCE: Basic Skills, Career Technical Education, Disability Support Services, and English as a Second Language. Continuous enrollment is enrollment in any two of the previous four consecutive terms, including summer, resulting in an academic record symbol of A, B, C, D, F, P (Pass), NP (No Pass), SP (Satisfactory Progress), or W (Withdrawal). Missing more than two consecutive terms will result in loss of catalog rights due to a break in continuous enrollment.

For example:



If continuous enrollment is broken, the student must adhere to the catalog requirements in effect at the time continuous enrollment is re-established and maintained.

The lab enrollment in CCTR/100, keyboarding exams, and required certifications (e.g. CPR card) cannot be used to maintain catalog rights. Course substitution and course challenges do not maintain catalog rights either. This policy supersedes all previous catalog rights provisions and applies only to the programs at SCE.

GRADING POLICY: Students enrolled in apportionment courses are awarded an evaluative symbol at the conclusion of each course. The grade issued will become part of the student's permanent academic history and will appear on their SCE transcript.

Students enrolled in a Career Development and College Preparation (CDCP) course are advised that they will be issued a grade that will appear on their SCE transcript and permanent academic history. If a student does not wish to be graded, they must drop the course prior to the eighth hour of instruction. While an instructor may drop a student for excessive absences, it is the student's responsibility to officially withdraw from a class. If a student withdraws after the eighth hour of instruction, but prior to the last quarter of instruction, the student will receive a "W" grade on their transcript, regardless of whether the drop was initiated by the student or instructor. Students may not drop a course after the start the final quarter of the course. Please visit www.sce.edu/gradingpolicy for further information.

OPEN ENROLLMENT: It is the policy of the North Orange County Community College District (NOCCCCD) that, unless specifically exempted by statue, every course section or class, the full-time equivalent students (FTES) attendance of which is to be reported for state aid, whenever offered and maintained by NOCCCD, shall be fully open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the college(s) or School of Continuing Education

and who meets such prerequisites as may be established pursuant to Chapter II, Division 2, part VI, Title 5 of the California Administrative Code, commencing with Section 51820.

ACADEMIC HONESTY: Students are expected to abide by ethical standards in preparing and presenting material which demonstrates their level of knowledge and which is used to determine grades. Such standards are founded on basic concepts of integrity and honesty. These include, but are not limited to the following areas:

1. Students shall not plagiarize, which is defined as:

A. stealing or passing off as one's own ideas or words of another, or B. using a creative production without crediting the source.

The following cases constitute plagiarism:

*paraphrasing published material without acknowledging the source; *making significant use of an idea or a particular arrangement of ideas, e.g. outlines;

*writing a paper after consultation with persons who provide suitable ideas and incorporating these ideas into the paper without acknowledgement; or

*submitting under one's own name term papers or other reports which have been prepared by others.

2. Students shall not cheat, which is defined as:

A. using notes, aids, or the help of other students on tests or exams in ways other than those expressly permitted by the instructor; or

B. misreporting or altering the data in laboratory or research projects involving the collection of data.

- 3. Students shall not submit an original paper or project to more than one class without approval from the second
- instructor. Instructors who do not accept previously- submitted papers should inform students in the course syllabus.
- 4. Students shall not furnish materials or information in order to enable another student to plagiarize or cheat.

Instructors may deal with academic dishonesty in one or more of the following ways:

- 1. Assign an appropriate academic penalty such as an oral reprimand or point reduction.
- 2. Assign zero points on all or a particular paper, project, or exam.
- 3. Report to the appropriate administrators, with notification of same to the student(s), for disciplinary action by the school. Such a report will be accompanied by supporting evidence and documentation. See Student Conduct Policy for additional information.

STUDENT CONDUCT POLICY

Standards of Student Conduct and Discipline Policy

The standards of student conduct and disciplinary action for violation of Board Policy 5500 were approved by the NOCCCD Board on January 28, 2003, and were drawn in compliance with Sections 66300, 76030, 76033, 7034, 76036 of the State Education Code. Students are expected to respect and obey civil and criminal law and shall be subject to the legal penalties for violation of the city, county, state, and national laws(s).

Student conduct must conform to Board Policy and college regulations and procedures. As cited in BP5500, "A student who violates the standards of student conduct shall be subject to disciplinary action including, but not limited to the removal,

suspension, or expulsion of the student. Misconduct which constitutes "good cause" for disciplinary action includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- 1. Disruptive behavior, willful disobedience, habitual profanity or vulgarity, the open and persistent defiance of the authority of, or persistent abuse of District personnel, or violating the rights of other students.
- 2. Failure to identify oneself when requested to do so by District officials acting in the performance of their duties.
- Cheating, plagiarism in connection with an academic program (including plagiarism in a student publication), or engaging in other academic dishonesty.
- Dishonesty, forgery, alteration, or misuse of District documents, records, or identification, or knowingly furnishing false information to the District.
- 5. Misrepresentation of oneself or of an organization to be an agent of the District.
- 6. Causing, attempting to cause, or threatening to cause physical injury or physical or verbal abuse or any threat of force or violence, to the person, property, or family of any member of the college community, whether on or off District property as defined above.
- 7. Willful misconduct which results in injury or death to a student or to District personnel, or which results in the cutting, defacing, or other damage to any real or personal property of the District
- 8. Unauthorized entry into, unauthorized use of, or misuse of property of the District.
- 9. Stealing or attempting to steal District property or private property on District premises, or knowingly receiving stolen District property or stolen private property on District premises.
- Causing or attempting to cause damage to District property, or to private property on District premises.
- 11. Unlawful use, sale, possession, offer to sell, furnishing, or being under the influence of any controlled substance listed in the California Health and Safety Code, section 11053 et seq., an alcoholic beverage or an intoxicant of any kind, or any poison classified as such by Schedule D in Section 4160 of the Business and Professions Code or other State law defining controlled substance while on District property, or at a District function; or unlawful possession of, or offering, arranging or negotiating the sale of any drug paraphernalia, as defined in the California Health and Safety Code, section
- 12. Willful or persistent smoking in any area where smoking has been prohibited by law or by regulation of the District.
- Possession, sale, use, or otherwise furnishing of explosives, dangerous chemicals, deadly weapons or other dangerous object including but not limited to, any facsimile firearm, knife or explosive on District property, or at a District function, without prior written authorization of the Chancellor, college president, School of Continuing Education Provost, or authorized designee.
- 14. Engaging in lewd, indecent, or obscene behavior on District property, or at a District function.
- 15. Violation of municipal, state, or federal laws in connection with attendance in programs or services offered by the District, or while on District property or at District-sponsored
- 16. Soliciting or assisting another to do any act (including the purchasing, transporting or consumption of any controlled substance), while under the supervision of a District official, which would subject a student to expulsion, suspension, probation, or other discipline pursuant to this policy.
- 17. Attempting any act constituting cause for disciplinary action as identified in the above sections of this policy.
- 18. Committing sexual harassment as defined by law or by District policies and procedures.
- 19. Engaging in harassing or discriminatory behavior based on disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression,

- nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or any other status protected by law.
- 20. Engaging in physical or verbal intimidation or harassment of such severity or pervasiveness as to have the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance, or District employee's work performance, or of creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational or work environment.
- 21. Engaging in physical or verbal disruption of instructional or student services activities, administrative procedures, public service functions, authorized curricular or co-curricular activities or prevention of authorized guests from carrying out the purpose for which they are on District property.
- 22. Stalking, defined as a pattern of conduct by a student with intent to follow, alarm, or harass another person, and which causes that person to reasonably fear for his or her safety, and where the student has persisted in the pattern of conduct after the person has demanded that the student cease the pattern of conduct. Violation of a restraining order shall, without more, constitute stalking under this policy.
- 23. Persistent, serious misconduct where other means of correction have failed to bring about proper conduct or where the presence of the student causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of students or others.
- 24. Engaging in expression which is obscene, libelous, or slanderous according to current legal standards, or which so incites students as to create a clear and present danger of the commission of unlawful acts on District property, or the violation of the lawful administrative procedures of the District, or the substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the
- 25. Use of the District's computer systems or electronic communication systems and services for any purpose prohibited by Administrative Procedures 3720, Computer & Electronic Communication Systems, or for any act constituting cause for disciplinary action as provided in this policy.

Furthermore, no student shall be suspended from a college or School of Continuing Education program or expelled unless the conduct for which the student is disciplined is related to college, School of Continuing Education or District activity or attendance. Also any violation of law, ordinance, regulation or rule regulating, or pertaining to, the parking of vehicles, shall not be cause for removal, suspension or expulsion of a student. The Chancellor shall establish procedures for the imposition of discipline on students in accordance with the requirements for due process of law. The procedures shall identify potential disciplinary actions including, but not limited to, the removal, suspension, or expulsion of a student.

The Chancellor shall establish procedures of which all students are informed of the rules and regulations governing student behavior
