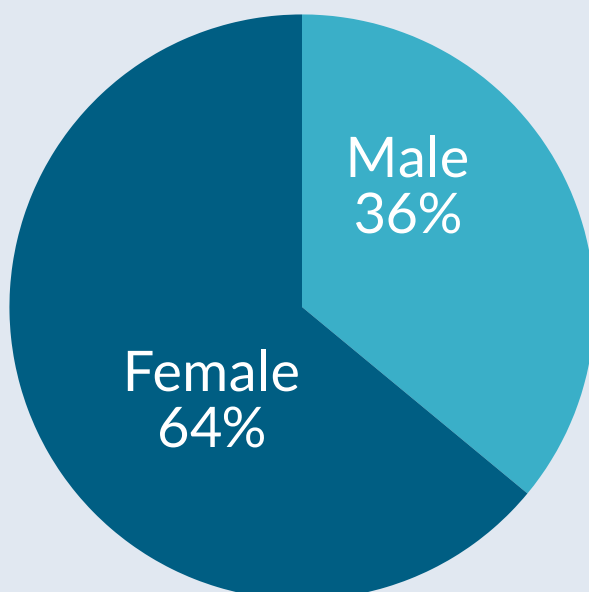

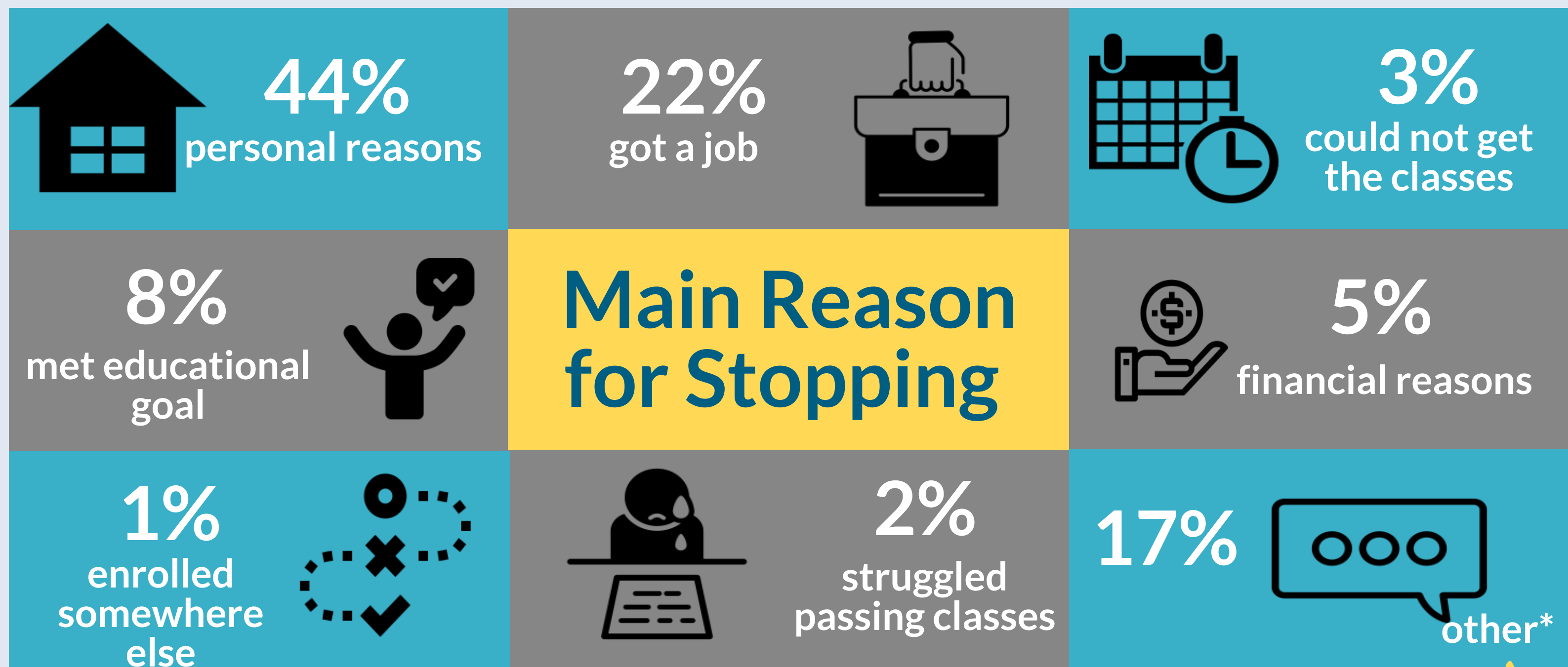
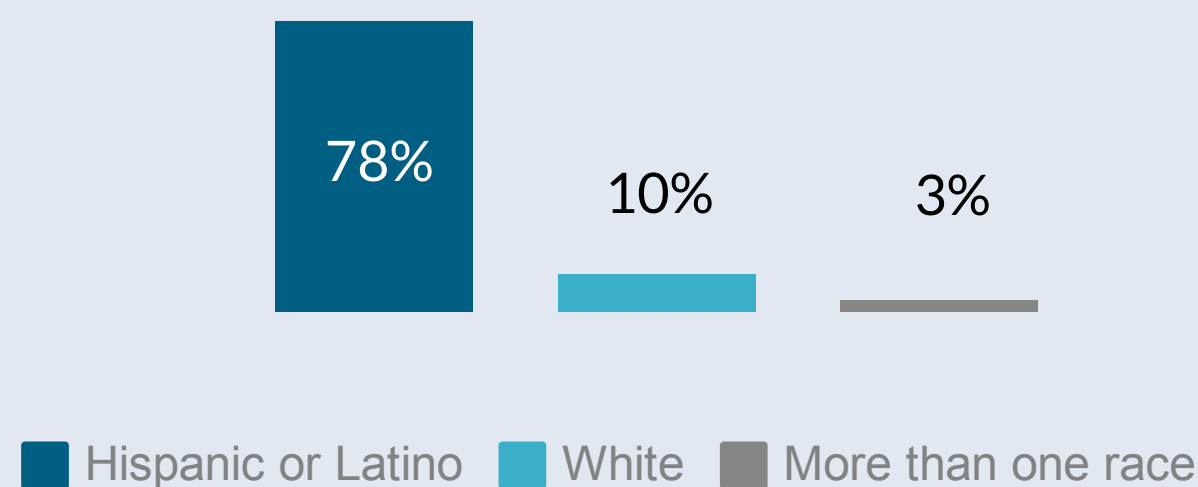
### Age

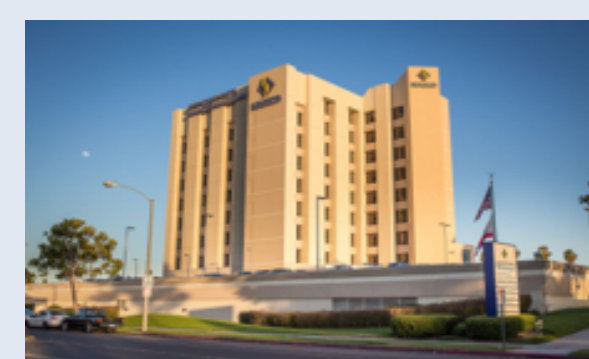

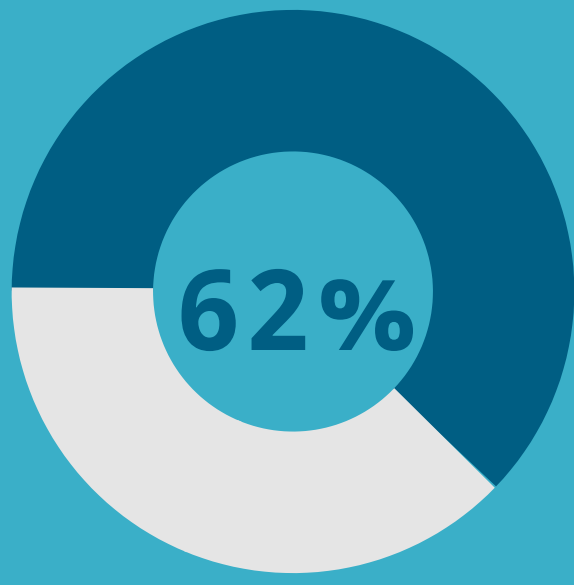

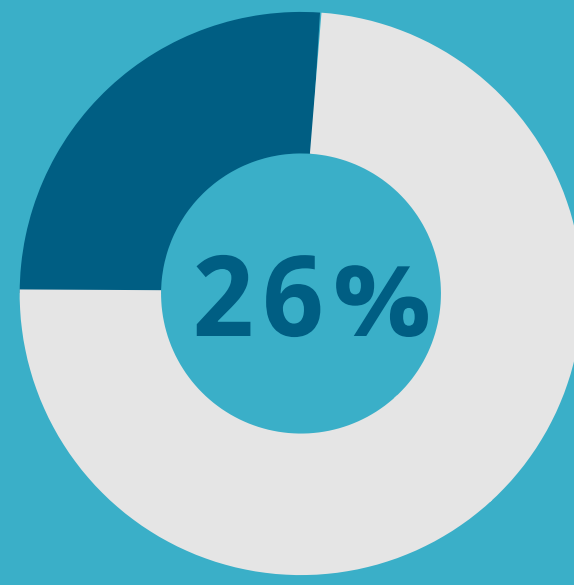

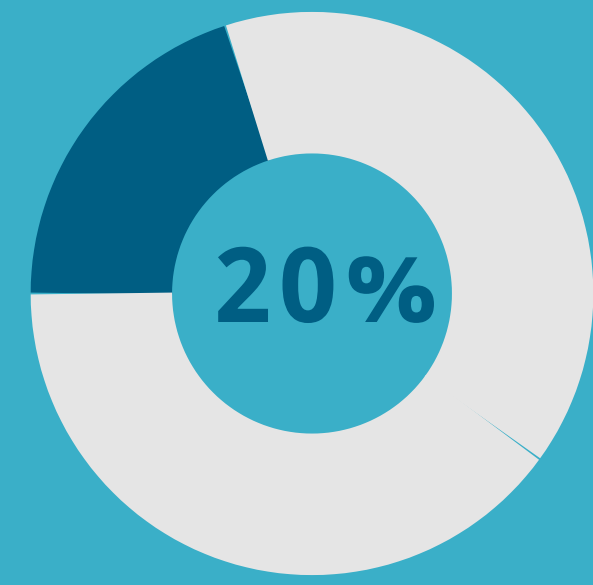
## Among those who selected personal and financial

Working more hours

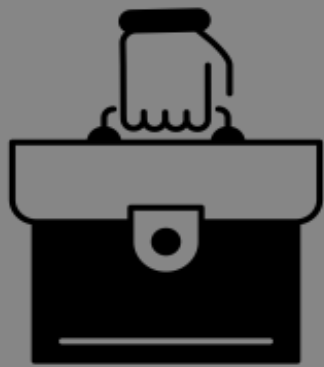


Transportation to and from school was difficult

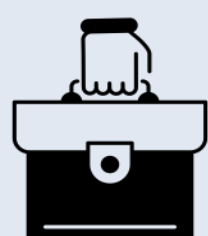
