She has written about and lectured on the traditional and contemporary history of the Day of the Dead. Join us as Flores provides history on Dia de Los Muertos, the altars' significance, and the three deaths.

There's a saying in Mexico that one can die three deaths: the first when life ends; the second when the body returns to the earth; and the third when one ceases to exist in the memories of those still living. In Mexico, an altar is built every year for the Day of the Dead on November 1-2 in remembrance of the dead and to prevent this third tragic death.
