- O Does not have a HS diploma or equivalency.

- O Educational Plan


Adult Dual Enrollment (SB) 544

- Dual enrollment is an exciting and unique opportunity for current SCE students to earn FREE TRANSFERABLE college credit through Santa Ana College (SAC). Dual enrollment students (also known as special admit students) can take courses taught at their high school, at SAC, on the weekends, or online.
- Students can enroll in up to 15 units every fall and spring semester, 6 units max for winter intersession, and 9 units max for summer (as long as prerequisite courses are met).




Career Education Articulation Agreements In Progress & Being Developed

CDCP Certificates

- All articulated courses are included in noncredit Career Ed. CDCP Certificates.
- Certificates were designed in collaboration between noncredit & credit faculty to better prepare students to succeed once they transition.
 - O For the exception of Pharmacy Technology, certificates also prepare students for entry-level employment.
- Other courses in the certificates include:
 - Soft skills
 - Contextualized English
 - Contextualized Math



Intro to Automotive Technology Cert.

- Courses:
 - Required:
 - Introduction to Automotive Vehicle Systems (articulated course)
 - O Complete ONE of the following:
 - Introduction to Customer Service Skills
 - Employability Skills
 - English for Work 2
 - Math for College & Career Readiness



Articulated Courses Delivery Model

- Noncredit section cross listed with a credit section
 - O Certain number of seats, established by credit, are reserved for noncredit students.
- Noncredit section is created & not cross listed.
 - All seats are for noncredit students.
 - O Since certain adjunct and tenured faculty are cross hired to teach on both sides of the college, noncredit students still get instruction from a credit faculty member.
 - Helps with making the transition seamless for students once they are ready to move over to credit.
- Students must earn a B or higher in the course to petition for credit.

- Currently taking a catering business class at Long Beach City College.




Student Success Conference
