






It's about relationships

Integrated Education & Training (IET)

- Requires all 3 academic components
- All 3 program courses are <u>contextualized</u> for specific industry
- All 3 faculty <u>coordinate</u> syllabi, weekly modules, learning outcomes, etc.
- Students apply, attend orientation, get accepted, commit to attend all components.
 - Akin to Career Advancement Academies/I-Best

Noncredit Work Experience

- Provides students with practical, hands-on learning opportunities in real-world work environments.
- Designed to help students develop job skills, gain professional experience, and improve their employability without the pressure of earning academic credit.
- Two "frames"
 - General = great for on-campus student workers; in line with Adult Ed Category "workforce prep" or options that are in line with service-learning, project-based learning, or civic engagement learning opportunities.
 - Industry Specific = great for short-term vocational programs specific to the industry internship
 - Akin to general CoopEd and discipline-specific CoopEd



A partnership between the San Diego College of Continuing Education (SDCCE) and San Diego City College, San Diego Mesa College, and San Diego Miramar College. The initiative is designed to help students achieve their academic and career goals by providing a clear and seamless pathway to a degree or certificate program.




Noncredit to Credit Pathway: Credit-By-Exam

- Connects existing SDCCE courses to SDCCD credit college courses
- Faculty-led agreement development
- Develops collaboration between colleges
- Accelerates credit college degree and/or certificate completion
- Saves students time & money
- Minimizes credit course duplication
- Low risk to student (credit is optional)
- Provides work-based learning opportunities for students


