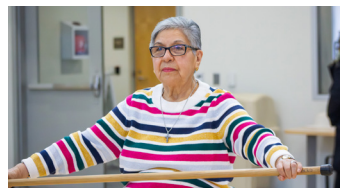

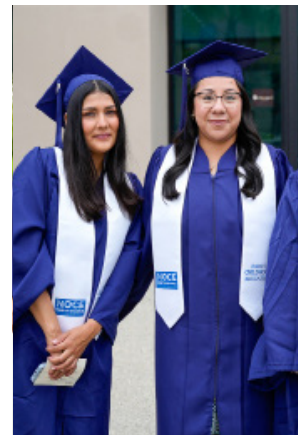

Student Success Spotlight: Miguel Soto Troccoly

NOCE Alumni Soars

NOCE alumnus **Miguel Soto Troccoly** exemplifies the transformative power of adult education through his academic achievements, professional success, and commitment to service. Miguel first enrolled at NOCE to complete his High School Diploma, graduating with high honors. He later pursued the Pharmacy Technician Certificate Program but paused due to personal challenges. In Fall 2020, he returned to NOCE during the COVID-19 pandemic, balancing online coursework while helping with his family's business. Within one year, he completed both the Management Certificate and Business Information Worker I Certificate.
