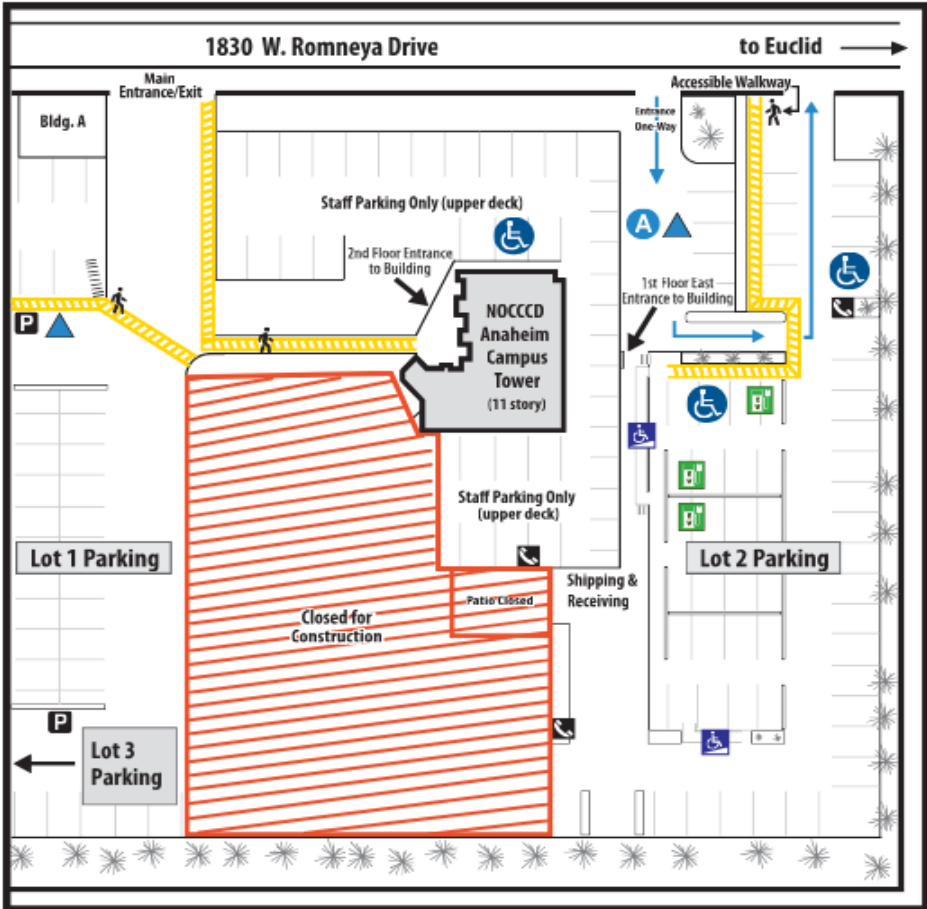

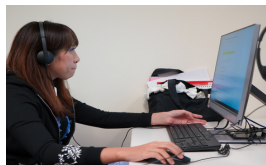

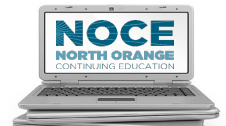

Understanding the Class Schedule

How to Read Course Listings

Course Title: Pharmacy Technician, Lab for the In-Patient (Formerly MEDO 221)

Prerequisite; corequisite; and/or advisory: PTEC 105 Pharmacy Operations Lab and PTEC 110 Pharmaceutical Mathematics and PTEC 115 Pharmacology I and PTEC 120 Pharmacology II. Course covers the preparation of medications given by intravenous, epidural and subcutaneous routes of administration. The student will learn aseptic techniques, pharmacy IV calculations, drug compatibilities and stabilities, IV therapy management, and specialized equipment. The laboratory incorporates use of laminar and vertical flow hoods and computerized software for IV preparation. **Textbook Required.**

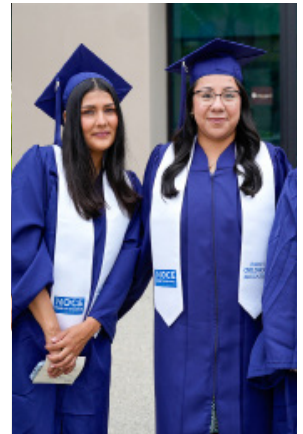

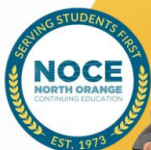

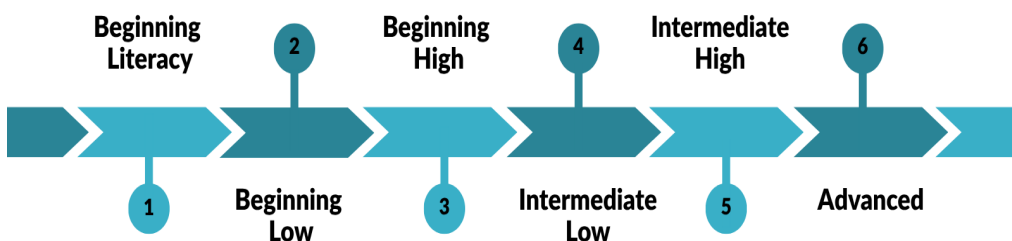
Program Overview

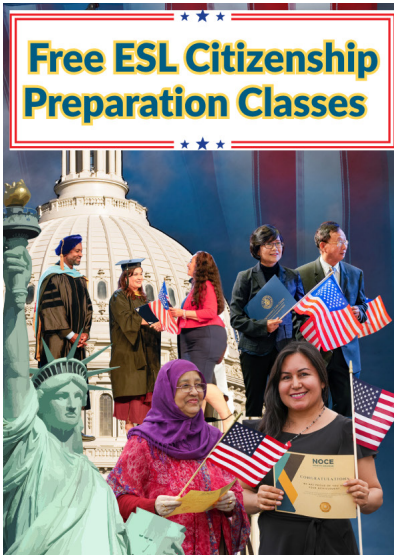
